# STUDY NUMBER NINE: Fellowship is Preserved by Discernment

#### 1 John 4:1-6

Key Verse 4:1: "Beloved, stop believing every spirit, but keep on putting the spirits to the test to see if they are from God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world."

### TEXT:

- <u>v. 1</u> Beloved, stop believing every spirit, but keep on putting the spirits to the test to see if they are from God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world.
- <u>v. 2</u> In this you are knowing the Spirit of God: every spirit that is confessing Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God.
- <u>v. 3</u> And every spirit which is not confessing Jesus is not from God; and this is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world.
- $\underline{v}$ . 4 You are from God, little children, and you have conquered them; because greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world.
- v. 5 They themselves are out of the world. On this account, out of the world they are speaking, and the world is hearing them.
- <u>v. 6</u> We ourselves are from God; the one who is knowing God is hearing us; he who is not from God is not hearing us. From this we are knowing the Spirit of truth and the spirit of error.

### **INTRODUCTION:**

(<u>The Grass Is Always Greener Over the Septic Tank</u> by Erma Bombeck)

A lot of my neighbors suffered from the Car Pool Crouch. It was one of those dreaded diseases you say can never happen to you.

Then one afternoon when you are attending a tea, someone will point out that your knees are apart and your right foot is extended out in an accelerator position. Your elbows are bent slightly and you are holding your purse in front of you like a steering wheel. When a woman leans forward next to you, your arm automatically goes out to catch her when she hits the windshield that isn't there.

You've got it. The Car Pool Crouch.

I have seen perfectly healthy, young, upright women climb into a car in September. By spring, they walked like Groucho Marx.

Out of this malady came the invention of the drive-in. A lot of people think the drive-in was born out of convenience. That's not true. It was born out of desperation of a community of women who could no longer get in and out of their cars.

I once went for an entire week behind the wheel of the car and never missed a beat running my house.

I drove the children to school, idling my motor as they tumbled out of the back seat.

Then it was on to the bank where I pulled in to within inches of the window, slid my check under a bean bag in the drawer, and massaged my legs as I waited.

With money by my side, I next pulled into the cleaners where I left off a bundle and was rewarded with hangers full of clean ones.

At the film service drive-in, I barely had to slow down the car. Just make a hook shot and promise to be back by tomorrow.

At the service station, I sat numbly while he checked my oil, my water, and cleaned off my glasses.

Then it was lunchtime and into a drive-in eatery for a guick bite.

Positioning my wheels on the pulley, I sat in my car while I went through the car wash, feeling just a little uncomfortable with the numbness that was causing shooting back pains.

But there was the post office that had to be driven through and then it was time to pick up the children.

Naturally, we drove to a drive-in for a slushee treat and as dusk was approaching, we hit for a drive-in movie.

On the seventh day, my husband said, "Look, you've been in that car all week. You're pale. You need fresh air. You are also very short. Let's go to that new church everyone is talking about over on Rural Road."

I dressed carefully. And painfully. It had been a long time.

Hesitating, I climbed into the car. It was a drive-in church.

I opened my door and with great effort, pushed my legs out. Steadying myself, I grabbed onto the car with my hands and pulled myself up to my feet. I was standing.

#### HE TAKES OUR PLACE

A valuable painting had been purchased by F. W. Boreham called "The Chess Player." It portrayed Satan playing the game with a young opponent, and the man's soul was at stake. He then made a move that showed how the devil's captive could have won and been set free.

In this series of studies we have been talking about the matter of FELLOWSHIP WITH THE FATHER.

By the term "fellowship," we are referring to COMMUNION or COMMUNICATION. We are walking in fellowship with our heavenly Father by keeping company with Him, because we are of KINDRED SPIRITS, and because there is no sin which is breaking our fellowship or any disobedience which is serving as a cause of offense.

In <u>Study #5</u>, we talked about "FELLOWSHIP IS BEING EDUCATED BY HIS SPIRIT." When we became Christians, the Holy Spirit came to dwell in us and to guide us into truth.

This was the POSITIVE side of John's teaching, and now we come to the NEGATIVE side of it, that is, the Spirit of God has also been given to enable us to PRESERVE OUR FELLOWSHIP BY DISCERNMENT.

# Ephesians 4:14

As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming;

One of the outgrowths of fellowship with the Father will be the function of the Spirit of God preserving our fellowship by enabling us to DISCERN TRUTH from ERROR.

# Westcott says:

This section is closely connected both with what precedes and with what follows; and corresponds with

the first section of this great division of the Epistle:

- ii. 18-29. It contains three main thoughts:
  - 1. There are many spiritual influences at work (v. 1).
  - 2. The test of spirits lies in the witness to the incarnation (vv. 2, 3).
  - 3. The test of men lies in the recognition of the Truth (vv. 4, 5).

The progress of thought is parallel to that in ii.

18-29, but the argument of St John has passed to a new stage. There his teaching was centred in the Messiahship, the Sonship of Jesus: here in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. p. 139

# Stott points out:

They needed to be shown that 'to identify the Supernatural and the Divine is a perilous mistake.' John's concern was that they should test not so much the character of inspired utterance, whether it was genuine or spurious, as its origin, whether it was diabolical or divine.

# J. Vernon McGee says:

This is a very important passage, but there is a danger of going off the deep end here and becoming rather fanatical. I believe that there is an abnormal preoccupation with the occult on the part of many Christians today which is a most dangerous thing, but we do need to know what the bible teaches about it.

In the first six verses of this chapter, John gives a warning against false teachers, false prophets. He gives us this warning, having just established the fact that we have been given the Spirit of God and that we have been given an anointing to understand the things of God.

Paul Van Gorder titles this section:

"How to Spot the Devil's Kids"

Federal law is now calling for "truth in advertising." The labels of products must contain an accurate listing of the ingredients. The consumer is encouraged to "read carefully before using." A similar caution is given to believers in 1 John 4:1-6. Before a believer swallows all that is packaged "Christian," he is advised to do some testing. Not everyone who comes in the name of Christ is a representative of the truth.

<u>v. 1</u> Beloved, stop believing every spirit, but keep on putting the spirits to the test to see if they are from God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world.

John addresses these young Christians as "BELOVED."

This is the 2nd NEGATIVE WARNING in the book.

The 1st one was chapter 2:15 where we are told to:

"Stop loving the world, neither the things which are in the world. If a man keeps on loving the world, the love of the Father is not in him."

And now the 2ND NEGATIVE WARNING in the book is:

"BELOVED, STOP BELIEVING EVERY SPIRIT."

This verse takes us back to:

# chapter 3:23:

"And this is His commandment, that we should believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and loving one another, as He gave us commandment."

Our belief is to be in Jesus Christ, and our love is to be for each other, which is a manifestation of our belief in Jesus Christ.

#### 1 John 2:27

As for you, the anointing which you received from Him is abiding in you, and you are not having need that anyone keep on teaching you; but even as His anointing is teaching you concerning all things, and is true and is not a lie, and even as He taught you, keep on abiding in Him.

This is our KEY VERSE for this 9th study:

"FELLOWSHIP IS PRESERVED BY DISCERNMENT."

# The Bible Knowledge Commentary says:

To begin with, the Spirit of God must be distinguished from false spirits.

# Dr. Mitchell says:

God asks us to test people. We are to use spiritual discernment because many false prophets are gone out into the world. How can we do this? One man says the Bible teaches this, and another man says the Bible teaches that. Someone else says the Bible is not to be trusted at all. How can we know that which is of God and that which is not of God?

We are to test a person on the basis of what he confesses about the Person of Jesus Christ.

### Van Gorder says:

Religious deceivers most certainly abound today! They have invaded our pulpits, our colleges, our theological seminaries, and even our homes. The false prophets of our day, sometimes masked in religious respectability, launch continual assaults upon God's Word and His Christ.

Why is it necessary for us to be careful not to be believing every spirit? And why is it necessary for John to give us this warning?

"STOP BELIEVING EVERY SPIRIT, BUT KEEP ON PUTTING THE SPIRITS TO THE TEST TO SEE IF THEY ARE FROM GOD."

#### 2 Corinthians 11:13-15

For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. Therefore it is not surprising if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their deeds.

### 2 Peter 2:1-3

But false prophets also arose among the people, just as there will also be false teachers among you, who will secretly introduce destructive heresies, even denying the Master who bought them, bringing swift destruction upon themselves. And many will follow their sensuality, and because of them the way of the truth will be maligned; and in their greed they will exploit you with false words; their judgment from long ago is not idle, and their destruction is not asleep.

### 2 Peter 2:17, 18

These are springs without water, and mists driven by a storm, for whom the black darkness has been reserved. For speaking out arrogant words of vanity they entice by fleshly desires, by sensuality, those who barely escape from the ones who live in error,

# 2 Timothy 3:5

holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power; and avoid such men as these.

# Jude 11

Woe to them! For they have gone the way of Cain, and for pay they have rushed headlong into the error of Balaam, and perished in the rebellion of Korah.

It is our responsibility as maturing Christians in the Lord Jesus, through our fellowship with the Father, to be careful not to believe every spirit that speaks, but to:

"KEEP ON PUTTING THE SPIRITS TO THE TEST TO SEE IF THEY ARE FROM GOD."

#### **NEGATIVELY:**

We are not to be "BELIEVING EVERY SPIRIT,"

#### POSITIVELY:

We are to "KEEP ON PUTTING THE SPIRITS TO THE TEST TO SEE IF THEY ARE FROM GOD."

There are spirits that are not from God and are meant to lead us astray, therefore it is necessary for us to:

"KEEP ON PUTTING [THEM] TO THE TEST."

These spirits are characterized by the 3 F's:

- 1. THEY ARE FALSE
- 2. THEY PRECIPITATE FEAR
- 3. THEY ARE A <u>FAKE</u>

The word "TO TEST" is a technical word used of "testing or assaying of metal" to see if it rings true or is up to standard.

The reason John has given this command is seen in the last phrase of our verse:

"BECAUSE MANY FALSE PROPHETS HAVE GONE OUT INTO THE WORLD."

#### Westcott says:

The use of the term <u>false prophets</u> in the N.T. is suggestive. It is applied to the rivals of the true prophets under the old dispensation; and to the rivals of the apostles under the new dispensation; and especially, in the Apocalypse, to the embodied power of spiritual falsehood. The false-prophet is not only a false-teacher, but a false-teacher who supports his claims by manifestations of spiritual power. p. 140

# J. Vernon McGee says:

Ouite a few things which have happened in our day are really spooky. We had, for instance, the appearance of the book, Jonathan Livingston Seagull. The author, Richard Bach, said that a voice dictated the book to him and that it was not his own style of writing. I understand that many churches recommended the reading of this book and that several good men were taken in by it. It is the story about a theological concept of a young sea gull which has human attributes. He soared off toward unlimited perfection and found that each of us is just an idea of the Great Gull. This book teaches that birth and sin and sickness and death are not realities but only illusions, that what the biblical writers call sins really are virtues, and that freedom is freedom to do what one pleases. All of that is not new but is actually out of the very pit of hell itself--it is satanic. p. 800

# Matthew 7:15

Beware of the false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves.

### Matthew 24:11

And many false prophets will arise, and will mislead many.

### Matthew 24:24

For false Christs and false prophets will arise and will show great signs and wonders, so as to mislead, if possible, even the elect.

What we are saying in this particular study, is that one of the greatest safeguards against error is our fellowship with the Father. As we are dependent upon the Holy Spirit to guide us into truth, we can also be dependent upon the same Spirit to enable us to discern when someone is not speaking from God, and thus with this discernment, preserve our fellowship with the Father.

I have heard so many say, "Well, I'm going to take a little truth from every religion. This way I know I'll be safe as far as my eternal destiny is concerned." This does not agree with John's position here when he says truth resides in Jesus Christ.

### John 8:32

and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

### THE THRIVING CULT OF GREED AND POWER

Scientology poses as a religion but is really a ruthless global scam--and aiming for the mainstream.

Begun by science-fiction writer L. Ron Hubbard to "clear" people of their discontentment, the church of Scientology is making a lot of people unhappy these days. Hundreds of Scientology followers in recent years have left the cult and later brought accusations of mental and physical abuse. Some have brought lawsuits and won. Others have settled out of court, sometimes getting as much as half a million dollars. A number of cult leaders, including the founder's wife, were sent to prison in the early 1980s for criminal activities they engaged in to keep government agencies from investigating them.

Yet Scientology continues to flourish as its 700 centers in 65 countries use new strategies to lure unsuspecting people into their financial web. A variety of front groups ranging from publishing to health care have proven quite successful. In fact, one cult-monitoring group that has information on over 200 mind control groups says that Scientology extracts more money from its members than any other cult.

Even though most cults die with their founder, Scientology has continued to grow since Hubbard died in 1986. For example, just one of its many arms, the Church of Spiritual Technology, brought in \$503 million in 1987 alone. The current head of the church, 31-year-old high school dropout David Miscavige, has been working hard to improve Scientology's image. They have retained a powerful public relations firm, bought huge quantities of their own books from retail stores in order to keep Scientology titles on the best-seller lists, and recruited rich professionals through groups that keep their connection to the church a secret.

Scientology claims to have eight million members, but the actual figure is probably closer to 50,000 active members. These people pay hundreds of dollars for communications courses, counseling sessions, and training seminars in order to progress through the various levels of the church. In addition, they purchase many expensive books and tapes. Though the church is trying hard to present itself as a respectable philosophy, the bottom line is that making money is what Scientology is all about. In one of his speeches to church officials, Hubbard reportedly said, "Make sure that lots of bodies move through the shop. Make money. Make more money. Make others produce so as to make money. However you get them in or why, just do it."

#### WHEN GOD WAS A WOMAN

Whether they are reviving a vanished faith or inventing a new one, it is the gender of the deity that counts.

Many Earth Day celebrations this year had religious (but not Christian) overtones. Across the U.S. a number of goddess-worshipers naturally got involved in the ecological celebrations since the deity they worship is often depicted as Gaia or Mother Earth. The goddess movement has been growing rapidly in this country, with some insiders claiming there are over 100,000 women involved. For these women, the Judeo-Christian God is too patriarchal, and they insist that the goddess is not just a female God. Rather than being transcendent like the God of the Bible, she is thought of as being present in every person and in everything in nature.

Her followers are involved in an eclectic variety of witchcraft, paganism, New Age concepts, and radical feminism. Proponents of goddess worship say that the movement is anything but new. They claim to be reviving an ancient religion that was wiped out by patriarchal religions around 4,000 B.C. Two recently published scholarly books use archaeological evidence to support this theory. Critics argue that the facts the feminist writers present are contradictory. One thing is clear, however, they consider the gender of the deity they worship more important than the historical roots of the current movement.

#### THE MAHARISHI'S NEW THINKING

As you put on the light with your hand, there'll be no more wars and there'll be no conflict among people. We are going to create that world of positivity.

-- Maharishi Mahesh Yogi.

In the basement of an old mansion just a few miles from the White House several hundred executives, attorneys, and physicians sit stiff and motionless on the floor in the lotus position for 20 minutes to an hour. Since early March groups have been coming twice a day to the Greater Washington D.C. Association of Professionals Practicing the Transcendental Meditation Program. But all this meditating is not just about selfenlightenment, it has a higher purpose. The goal of these followers of guru Maharishi Mahesh Yogi is to "transform Washington from the murder capital of the world to the center of peace and prosperity in the world." More specifically they hope to reduce violent crime in Washington by 15% over the next eight months. The TM group plans to open several other similar centers in the metropolitan area. They claim that a pilot project in which volunteers meditated between 1981 and 1987 reduced crime in the nation's capital by nearly 12%. The Maharishi has begun crime prevention programs in London and New Delhi as well. Also, prison administrators around the U.S. are being encouraged to use TM to rehabilitate prisoners and reduce recidivism. (The cost \$1500 per inmate.) What the Maharishi is really interested in, however, is to bring peace on a grander scale. He says if he can get 7,000 people in one location engaged in using his Sidhi advanced meditation technique on a regular basis, the result will be world peace. He is also working toward the 1993 opening of a billion-dollar amusement park in Florida to be called Veda Land.

In light of this, my encouragement for you today is that each one of us pursue what unites us with others rather than the few things that separate us. The "common ground" is vast. It's high time we focus on that. It will take grace, I remind you. p. 189

The richer and deeper my fellowship with the Father becomes and my knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ, the more able I am to discern by the direction of His Spirit when truth is being spoken.

When truth prevails:

there is peace,
there is unity.
there is transparency,

and honesty.

openness,

These are the questions we are asking ourselves in this 9th study:

Is our fellowship being preserved by our discernment?

Are we allowing the Spirit of God to guide us into all truth and to protect us from so many of these paths of error that are around us today?

<u>v. 2</u> In this you are knowing the Spirit of God: every spirit that is confessing Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God.

# The Bible Knowledge Commentary says:

The touchstone by which these spirits (false prophets) are to be tested is their attitude toward the incarnate person of Jesus Christ.

"IN THIS YOU ARE KNOWING THE SPIRIT OF GOD."

John is now going to present the test that he wants to be used in testing the spirits. The way you can tell the Spirit of God is by the following test:

"EVERY SPIRIT THAT IS CONFESSING JESUS CHRIST HAS COME IN THE FLESH IS FROM GOD."

It is God come in human flesh to take away sins and to destroy the works of the devil.

It is those who believe:

#### John 1:14

And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.

# 1 John 1:2

and the life was made visible, and we have seen [it] and we are bearing witness and we are proclaiming to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made visible to us--

The person who is confessing that JESUS CHRIST IS GOD COME IN HUMAN FLESH is of God.

It is the person believing in His deity, in His virgin birth, and in His mission to pay the penalty for man's sin and provide eternal salvation.

# Dr. Mitchell says:

Both John and Peter declared that Jesus Christ is God manifest in the flesh. "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).

Later, on the Isle of Patmos, John saw Jesus in His glory. "And when I saw him, I fell at his feet as dead, And he laid his right hand upon me, saying unto me, Fear not: I am the first and the last: I am he that liveth, and was dead: and behold, I am alive for evermore. Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death" (Rev. 1:17, 18).

Peter writes, "For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of his majesty" (2 Pet. 1:16).

You can recognize the false teachers by their failure to acknowledge or confess that:

"JESUS CHRIST HAS COME IN THE FLESH."

## 2 John 7

For many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who do not acknowledge Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh. This is the deceiver and the antichrist.

Many Christians tolerate a form of mysticism in reading their Bibles that they would allow in no other realm. They violate every tenet of reason and common sense. Their Bible study is totally subjective. They wander around the Scriptures, waiting for a liverquiver to tell them when they've struck pay dirt.

Now there's nothing wrong with having an emotional reaction to the Word of God. But as I mentioned in the last chapter, the meaning of the text is in the text, not in our subjective response to the text.

In Lewis Carroll's classic, Through the Looking-Glass (the second part of Alice in Wonderland), the White Queen engages Alice in an instructive dialogue:

"How old are you?"

"I'm seven and a half exactly."

"You needn't say 'exactly," the Queen remarked: "I can believe it without that. Now I'll give you something to believe. I'm just one hundred and one, five months and a day."

"I can't believe that," said Alice.

"Can't you?" the Queen said, in a pitying tone. "Try again: draw a long breath, and shut your eyes."

Alice laughed. "There's no use trying," she said: "one can't believe impossible things."

"I daresay you haven't had much practice," said the Oueen. "When I was your age, I always did it for half an hour a day. Why, sometimes I've believed as many as six impossible things before breakfast."

I'm afraid that's the condition of many people today. They think our faith means taking a deep breath, shutting our eyes, and believing what we know deep down is absolutely incredible. Christianity has even been caricatured as the nonthinking man's religion pp. 204-5

<u>v. 3</u> And every spirit which is not confessing Jesus is not from God; and this is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world.

JEHOVAH'S WITNESSES say:

"Jesus Christ was a man, neither more nor less."

MORMONISM says:

"Jesus, the Son of Adam, God, and Mary--the father has begotten him in his own likeness. Jesus was married at Cana to the Marys and Martha, whereby he could see his seed before he was crucified."

**UNITY** says:

"Jesus was not the Christ."

GARNER TED ARMSTRONG says:

"Jesus Christ is not God."

Much of MODERN THEOLOGY says:

"Jesus was divine and in the same sense all of us are divine, the same spark of divinity

only needs to be fanned into the flame."

# Dr. Mitchell says:

I say very bluntly that a great many ecclesiastical leaders in our country are not Christian because they deny the Incarnate Word of God. Let me say that if Jesus Christ is not God Incarnate, if He is not the sinless Son of God, then we do not have a Saviour. Then He had to die for His own sin and could not have died to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. This is precisely what these people are saying. #### Stott observes:

#### INTEGRITY CRISIS IN MINISTRY

"We are facing an integrity crisis. Not only is the conduct of the church in question, but so is the very character of the church."

--Warren Wiersbe.

The undeniable crisis of immorality in the ministry has reached the epidemic stage. The secular media is having a heyday, and respect for ministers has just about bottomed out. What has caused this crisis of integrity? Sinful human nature is the obvious root cause, but Satan has used some particular strategies to bring down pastors.

- (1) Materialism: The secular values of society have had a greater impact on the church than the church has had on society, and today many men in the ministry are after gold rather than God. For them the role model of the corporate CEO has replaced the scriptural example of the servant-shepherd.
- (2) Pride: Egotism is rampant as religious terminology is used to justify the drive for personal power and prestige.
  - (3) Deceitfulness: Exaggeration gives way to outright lying in many cases.
- (4) False teaching: Many are anemic in their understanding of biblical truth and thus have very shallow theology. This results in a tendency to fall either into legalism or, at the other extreme, emotionalism. Such an unstable doctrinal foundation cannot stand under pressure.

It might seem that these factors have no direct connection with immorality, but they do. If a man lacks self-control in one area (desire for affluence), it often spills over into other areas of his life (lust). Deceitfulness in regard to his own accomplishments may be reflected in a tendency to hide the truth in other ways (being unfaithful to his wife). Moral failures can usually be traced to three lacks: no daily personal walk with the Lord, failure to meditate on Scripture, and the absence of intimacy in the marriage.

Perhaps it is worthwhile at this point to quote a well-known remark of C. S. Lewis in one of his famous radio talks:

I am trying here to prevent anyone from saying the really silly thing that people often say about Him: "I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept His claim to be God." That's the one thing we mustn't say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said wouldn't be a great moral teacher. Either this man was and is the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. The issue is always Christ. Is He God who took His place in the human family? "The Word was with God, and the Word was God," and "the Word was made flesh." Jesus Christ is the image of the invisible God. In Him all the fulness of God is revealed. By Him all things consist. The fulness of the Godhead dwells in Him bodily. He is the brightness of God's glory and the express image of His person. The great question is the position that is given to Christ. Is He the center of all? Is this Jesus of Nazareth confessed to be God manifest in the flesh, both Lord and Christ? This is the issue.

Stott says:

John now turns from a consideration of the teachers and their message to an examination of the audience which listens to them.

In these remaining 3 verses it is easy to identify to whom John is speaking:

verse 4 - YOU

verse 5 - THEY

verse 6 - WE

"YOU ARE FROM GOD, LITTLE CHILDREN, AND YOU HAVE CONQUERED THEM" [that is, the antichrist or the false teachers].

## 1 John 2:13, 14

I am writing to you, fathers, because you have come to know the one who is from the beginning. I am writing to you, young men, because you have conquered the evil one. Here John gives them a message of assurance because they have been born into God's family by the new birth and their life is manifesting the fruit of that relationship. He is able to say with confidence that they are "FROM GOD."

What a blessed truth this is with all the error around them, that they were "FROM GOD."

"YOU ARE FROM GOD, LITTLE CHILDREN, AND YOU HAVE CONQUERED THEM."

The young men were commended for having "conquered the evil one" back in <u>chapter 2:13</u>,

and now the Christians are commended here for having "CONQUERED" the teachers that are inspired by the evil one.

It always seems like such nice guys teach error.

ELIJAH confronts the prophets of BAAL on Mount Carmel, and after the victory is won for the Lord he commands that the prophets of Baal all be slain.

This victory has taken place because these believers have been unwilling to go along with the error which has been promoted by these false teachers.

The reason for their victory is given in the next statement:

"BECAUSE GREATER IS HE WHO IS IN YOU THAN HE WHO IS IN THE WORLD."

and I give eternal life to them, and they shall never perish; and no one shall snatch them out of My hand.

My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand.

### John 12:31

Now judgment is upon this world; now the ruler of this world shall be cast out.

### OVERCOMING ANY ADDICTION

The article opens with a story of nose-spray addiction and the conclusion: "As soon as one tries to control any truly addictive behavior by making autonomous intentional resolutions, one begins to defeat oneself." The usual steps in a purely will-power approach to addiction is 1) I can do it. 2) Pride. 3) The fall. Theologically an addiction is an attempt to fulfill our longing for God through objects of attachment. For the power of addiction to be overcome, personal power must be aligned with the power of grace. If only the behavior is reformed, one addiction is often exchanged for another less destructive one. What God offers us is a deeper transformation of desire. "Every struggle with addiction, no matter how small, and no matter what our spiritual interest may be, will include some homeward call, some invitation to transformation. If we answer yes, even with the tiniest and most timid voice, our struggle becomes consecrated. Consecration means dedication to God. It occurs when we claim our deepest desire for God, beneath, above, and beyond all other things." Characteristics of a consecrated intent to break an addiction: 1) Honesty in accepting the addiction. 2) Dignity--acting as if we are created in God's image. 3) Community--seeking the companionship of and accountability to other people. 4) Responsibility--respecting ourselves and those around us. 5) Simplicity--stopping an addiction boils down to this: don't do it, refuse to do it, and keep refusing to do it.

John now shows the origins of these false teachers. Whereas the Christians are born of God, these false teachers are out of the world--the world as opposed to the Father--as we saw back in:

"ON THIS ACCOUNT, OUT OF THE WORLD THEY ARE SPEAKING."

Their message is from "THE WORLD" and not from the Father.

# Philippians 3:18, 19

For many walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even weeping, that they are enemies of the cross of Christ, whose end is destruction, whose god is their appetite, and whose glory is in their shame, who set their minds on earthly things.

# As J. B. Phillips says:

"This world is the limit of their vision."

The message which they give is strictly on a human plane and their audience is the world, and "THE WORLD IS HEARING THEM."

They have a message that the world likes to hear.

PAUL says of these men in writing to young TIMOTHY:

"they have a form of godliness but they deny the power of it, from such turn away. . . . They are ever learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth."

Then he goes on say:

"For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their desire shall they heap to themselves teachers having itching ears, and they shall turn away their ears from the truth and shall be turned unto fables."

Whereas their audience is the world, we are commanded by the apostle in:

### Romans 12:2

And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

# Barclay says:

When we come to think of it, that is an obvious truth. How can a man whose watchword is competition even begin to understand an ethic whose key-note is service? How can a man whose aim is the exaltation of the self, who believes in the survival of the fittest, and who holds that the weakest must go to the wall, even begin to understand a teaching whose principle for living is love? How can a man who believes that this is the only world, and that, therefore, material things are the only things which matter, even begin to understand a life which is lived in the light of eternity, and where it is the unseen things which are the greatest values in life?

# Mitchell says:

### **EVIL IN THE LAND**

Some law enforcement experts feel that Satanism is behind some bewildering crimes. Not only is the media making Americans more aware of Satanism, but the marketing industry is using Satanism to sell music, videos and literature. Of all levels of involvement, dabblers may be the most dangerous because they will try anything. Heavymetal music is often involved, and drugs are almost always part of the problem. The Satanist churches profess to not be involved in sacrifice or criminal activity. These groups are protected by law as long as this is true. More self-styled forms practice in the realms of illegal drugs, pornography, and child abuse. Law enforcement officials are hampered by the difficulty of infiltration. One expert points out that Satanism is always a destructive force. The intent is to kill and destroy. Christian experts warn that Satan is also an angel of light and we must not be deceived as we combat his more visible work. Demon or occult influences may be perceived by secularly trained psychologists as defense mechanisms (multiple personalities, etc.) invented for survival. Demonization appears in 17 instances in the Gospels. Jesus dealt specifically with 9. Mark 8:16 and Mark 1:32-34 indicate that he treated many more. Christians must recognize the reality of spiritual warfare, claim protection from God for those who are enslaved, and find practical ways to relieve those in bondage. Experienced counselor Kathy Snowden offers advice: spiritual and psychological healing takes a long-time commitment; be available for physical safety and basic necessities; emphasize the love and forgiveness of Christ more than submission; provide a calming, loving, caring, non-judgmental example for them; accept and support their positive characteristics and treat them normally (many of them carry shame for the activities they witnessed and were forced to take part in); control your own fear, you may be threatened and harassed, exercise your faith; encourage professional counseling; try to provide physical protection.

Once again the assurance comes. This is similar to <u>verse 4</u>:

"You are from God, little children."

This indicates that they have been born again by the Spirit into God's family.

"THE ONE WHO IS KNOWING GOD IS HEARING US."

### Matthew 13:13

Therefore I speak to them in parables; because while seeing they do not see, and while hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand.

# Revelation 3:22

He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

"THE ONE WHO IS KNOWING GOD," or has a personal relationship with the Father through His Son Jesus Christ, also has the ability to hear God's message:

### Isaiah 30:21

Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, "This is the way; walk in it."

### 1 Corinthians 2:14

But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God; for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised.

When a Christian is out of fellowship with the Father because of some disobedience, he will fail to hear what the Lord is saying:

## Hebrews 5:11, 12

Concerning him we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not solid food.

One of the joys of the new Suburban is that it has an AM/FM radio and cassette tape player. It is so easy to drive down the road and be listening to an AM station and then just by simply pushing a little button to fill the car with stereo music from an FM receiver.

You could greatly enjoy riding along with me and singing along with some of the great music of the past. You could also wish like crazy that you could enjoy this experience in your vehicle. It will be impossible as long as you just have an AM receiver. Getting an FM receiver will open up a whole new world of potential for you.

This, in essence, is what John is saying here:

"THE ONE WHO IS KNOWING GOD IS HEARING US."

### John 10:27

My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;

### 1 Samuel 3:9, 10

So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."

So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times. "Samuel! Samuel!"

Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

"WE OURSELVES ARE FROM GOD; THE ONE WHO IS KNOWING GOD IS HEARING US; HE WHO IS NOT FROM GOD IS NOT HEARING US."

Here is the contrast between the children of God and the children of the world. Those who do not have a relationship with God are unable to hear with perception and understanding the message which is given from God.

# 2 Timothy 4:3

For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires;

The believer who is walking in fellowship with the Father becomes increasingly more sensitive to the Spirit. The person who has no relationship with the Father is sensitive only to the self and to his own needs.

"WE OURSELVES ARE FROM GOD; THE ONE WHO IS KNOWING GOD IS HEARING US; HE WHO IS NOT FROM GOD IS NOT HEARING US. FROM THIS WE ARE KNOWING THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH AND THE SPIRIT OF ERROR."

By our ability to hear, we are able to determine those "OF TRUTH" and those "OF ERROR."

# Jeremiah 51:18

They are worthless, the objects of mockery; when their judgment comes, they will perish.

# 2 Timothy 2:18

men who have gone astray from the truth. . . .

### On the SPIRIT OF TRUTH we read in:

# John 14:17

that is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it does not behold Him or know Him, but you know Him because He abides with you, and will be in you.

### John 15:26

When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, that is the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, He will bear witness of Me,

### Jeremiah 23:17, 18

They keep saying to those who despise me, "The Lord says: You will have peace." And to all who follow the stubbornness of their hearts they say, "No harm will come to you." But which of them has stood in the council of the Lord to see or to hear his word? Who has listened and heard his word?

### Matthew 27:64

Therefore, give orders for the grave to be made secure until the third day, lest the disciples come and steal Him away and say to the people, "He has risen from the dead," and the last deception will be worse than the first.

Here the apostle John speaks of the "THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH" and "THE SPIRIT OF ERROR."

The word that is translated "ERROR" here is the word for:

"wandering,"

"roaming,"

"wandering from the path of truth,"

"error,"

"delusion,"

"deceit,"

"deception to which one is subject."
```

## 1 Thessalonians 2:3

For our exhortation does not come from error or impurity or by way of deceit;

## 2 Thessalonians 2:11

And for this reason God will send upon them a deluding influence so that they might believe what is false,

## 2 Peter 3:17

You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard lest, being carried away by the error of unprincipled men, you fall from your own steadfastness,

# 2 Peter 3:3-5

Know this first of all, that in the last days mockers will come with their mocking, following after their own lusts, and saying, "Where is the promise of His coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all continues just as it was from the beginning of creation." For when they maintain this, it escapes their notice that by the word of God the heavens existed long ago and the earth was formed out of water and by water,

## James 1:13-15

Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, and He Himself does not tempt anyone. But each one is tempted when he is carried away and enticed by his own lust. Then when lust has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin is accomplished, it brings forth death.

# Matthew 7:21-23

Not everyone who says to Me, "Lord, Lord," will enter the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven. As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming;

The answer to this is:

### Colossians 2:6-8

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ.

"THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH" is the Holy Spirit who has now come to dwell in us and to guide us into all truth. It is He that has anointed us by His indwelling so that we are capable of:

spiritual understanding,

discernment,

and separation of those things which are truth, and those which are error.

For instance, one of the important things one must understand in reading the Bible is that the Bible must dictate the questions it will answer. If you want to find out about Einstein's theory of relativity, don't go to the Bible. If you want to know how to build a school or make a million dollars or bake a cake, don't go to the Bible because that isn't the truth about which the Bible speaks. However, if you want to know who you are, what you are doing here, and where you are going, read your Bible. If you want to know the best way to live and die, read your Bible. If you want to know about God, what He is like, what He thinks about you, what His plans are for you, go to the Bible. All you will find there will be true, but it won't contain all truth.

On the other hand, no! Faith is not a blind leap. We are not suggesting that kind of faith Frederick Buechner describes as "the capacity to accept a lot of holy whoppers that an intelligent eighth grader would dismiss out of hand." It's not the kind of faith indicted in Archie Bunker's loose interpretation of Mark Twain's faith definition: "Faith is believing what any fool knows ain't so."

Instead, faith is a leap based not on proof, but on trust.

On August 23, 1864, Abraham Lincoln wrote out a memorandum on a piece of paper, folded it, and asked the entire cabinet of the United States to sign it without reading it. Amazingly, they did! By so doing, they committed themselves to the consequence of Lincoln's proposals without having read them.

That's strong faith--but not blind faith! Lincoln's cabinet had plenty of reason to believe in their President's proposal, even though they had not actually read the document. They had no proof. They knew Lincoln well enough to trust him. p. 52

As a child of God, it is my responsibility to heed the admonition of John here in verse 1:

"Beloved, stop believing every spirit, but keep on putting the spirits to the test to see if they are from God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world."

The basis for being able to perform this function is FELLOWSHIP WITH THE FATHER.

As I am in fellowship with Him, the Holy Spirit can carry on His function of guiding me into the truth of the word of God and also protecting me from the error of those who are not of God.

It is our responsibility to be discerning between truth and error, not between love and hate. We are not responsible for the attitude of the false teachers, but we are for our own.

### Van Gorder writes:

The beloved Louis Talbot wrote in his book <u>Heresies Exposed</u>, "The days in which you and I are living are days in which Christians need to know their Bibles, for the only way by which we may know whether or not a system of teaching is of God is by viewing the system through the lens of Holy Writ--reading the system in the light of the Bible and not reading the Bible in the light of the system."

### TACTICS AGAINST TEMPTATION

Christians are involved in a battle with Satan. If they are to win they must know the enemy. He is a personal, supernatural spirit-being, the ultimate source of evil. He has many demons to do his work. He also uses the world (world as described in 1 John 2:15 and Romans 12:2) to tempt us into sin. "Most of the world's temptations are not to things illegal or immoral, but to things subtly devastating to our spiritual welfare." Another tool of Satan is the flesh (as described in Gal. 5:17). It's an inside enemy. Many of our temptations are directed at our pride and ego. So there are three types of attack of temptation; and a strategy for fighting each one. Type A: Satan attacks the spirit. Note James 4:1. Use your Bible, but you must know it well. Psalm 119:11, Matt. 4:4, 7, 10. Type B: the world attacks the ego. Read 1 John 2:15. If you find yourself loving the world (usually a form of materialism) rekindle your love for God. The two are incompatible. If your relationship with God is right, the world is less attractive or important. Type C: The flesh attacks the appetites of the body (often sexual temptation). The strategy here is found in 2 Tim. 2:22 and 1 Cor. 6:18. Don't fight; flee!

As we continue to walk with the Lord, it ought to be our prayer that we would be increasingly sensitized by His Spirit to discern the difference between the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.
