he gospel writer Mark records that Jesus "rising up a great while before day... went out and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed." (1:35 KJV). Whenever and wherever you spend your time with the Father each day, we hope that these devotional verses and thoughts will be encouraging. Each Scripture selection from the New Testament comes from the NEW AMERICAN STANDARD and the Old Testament selections come from the NEW INTERNATIONAL VERSION.

JANUARY

January 1— Jeremiah 1:4, 5

The word of the Lord came to me, saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."

Lord, what a great joy this brings at the beginning of the new year, that you are so intimately involved in my life.

January 2— Jeremiah 1:8, 9

Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the Lord. Then the Lord reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "Now, I have put my words in your mouth."

REFLECTION		

Lord, may the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight.

January 3— Jeremiah 2:13

"My people have committed two sins: They have forsaken me, the spring of living water, and have dug their own cisterns, broken cisterns that cannot hold water."

Lord, I am here at Your spring this morning satisfying my spiritual thirst.

January 4— Jeremiah 3:22

"Return, faithless people; I will cure you of backsliding. Yes, we will come to you, for you are the Lord our God."

Lord, You and You alone, are the desire of my heart.

January 5— Jeremiah 4:14

O Jerusalem, wash the evil from your heart and be saved. How long will you harbor wicked thoughts?

Search me, O God, and know my heart, and know my thoughts.

January 6— Jeremiah 4:18

"Your own conduct and actions have brought this upon you. This is your punishment. How bitter it is! How it pierces to the heart!" Lord, I am reminded of the law of the harvest, whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

January 7— Jeremiah 4:22

"My people are fools; they do not know me. They are senseless children; they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil; they know not how to do good."

Lord, my desire is to get to know you better and better, that I might understand more fully your plan and purpose for my life.

REFLECTION		

January 8— Jeremiah 6:16

This is what the Lord says: "Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls. But you said, 'We will not walk in it." Lord, I want the ancient path, I want the good way, and I have found the rest for my soul.

January 9— Jeremiah 8:20

"The harvest is past, the summer has ended, and we are not saved." Lord, my prayer for today is that you will lead me to some souls that are ripe for harvest.

January 10— Jeremiah 9:23, 24

This is what the Lord says: "Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom or the strong man boast of his strength or the rich man boast of his riches, but let him who boasts boast about this: that he understands and knows me, that I am the Lord, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight," declares the Lord.

Lord, may I be characterized by the three things that bring delight to your heart, that is: Kindness, Justice, and Righteousness.

January 11— Jeremiah 10:6

No one is like you, O Lord; you are great, and your name is mighty in power.

Lord, my heart bows in worship, praising You because You are great and Your name is mighty in power.

REFLECTION					

January 12— Jeremiah 10:23

I know, O Lord, that a man's life is not his own; it is not for man to direct his steps.

Lord, since I belong to You, my prayer this day is for the guidance of your spirit.

January 13— Jeremiah 10:24

Correct me, Lord, but only with justice – not in your anger, lest you reduce me to nothing.

Lord, I am Your son, so discipline me as You see fit.

January 14— Jeremiah 12:5

"If you have raced with men on foot and they have worn you out, haw can you compete with horses? If you stumble in safe country, how will you manage in the thickets by the Jordan?"

Lord, I am claiming Your promise to Isaiah, that "They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint".

January 15— Jeremiah 14:7

Although our sins testify against us, O Lord, do something for the sake of your name. For our backsliding is great; we have sinned against you.

Lord, with the psalmist David I would pray: "Hide Your face from my sins and blot out all iniquity."

January 16— Jeremiah 15:16

When your words came, I ate them; they were my joy and my heart's delight, for I bear your name, O Lord God Almighty.

Lord, Your word is my joy and my heart's delight.

REFLECTION			

January 17— Jeremiah 16:17

My eyes are on all their ways; they are not hidden from me, nor is their sin concealed from my eyes.

Lord, I am comforted this day by the words of Proverbs 28:13 "He who conceals his sins does not prosper, but whoever confesses and renounces them finds mercy."

January 18— Jeremiah 17:7, 8

But blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; it's leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit.

Lord, according to the psalmist, if I delight in Your word and meditate on it day and night, I am going to be like a tree planted by streams of water which yields it's fruit in season.

January 19— Jeremiah 17:9

The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?

Test me, O Lord, and try me, examine my heart and my mind, for Your love is ever before me and I walk continually in Your truth.

January 20— Jeremiah 17:10

"I the Lord search the heart and examine the mind, to reward a man according to his conduct, according to what his deeds deserve."

Lord, I long for You to search my heart and examine my mind, because I want to bring You joy and delight this day.

REFLECTION		

January 21— Jeremiah 18:6

"O house of Israel, can I not do with you as this potter does?" declares the Lord. "Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, O house of Israel."

Lord, mold me and make me after Your will, while I am waiting, yielded and still.

January 22— Jeremiah 20:9

But if I say, "I will not mention him or speak any more in his name," his word is in my heart like a fire, a fire shut up in my bones. I am weary of holding it in; indeed, I cannot.

Lord, Your word is in my heart, so my prayer is for You to make me sensitive to the opportunities to proclaim Your truth.

January 23— Jeremiah 20:12

O Lord Almighty, you who examine the righteous and probe the heart and mind, let me see your vengeance upon them, for to you I have committed my cause.

Lord, thank You that You care enough to examine and to probe the heart and the mind. I place myself in Your hands to do that this day.

January 24— Jeremiah 23:22

REFLECTION

But if they had stood in my council, they would have proclaimed my words to my people and would have turned them from their evil ways and from their evil deeds.

Lord, help me to be faithful this day, to proclaim Your word, knowing that it will not return to You empty, but it will accomplish what You desire.

ALI ELCTION					

January 25— Jeremiah 23:29

"Is not my word life fire," declares the Lord, "and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?"

Lord, thank You that Your word is like a purifying fire and like a hammer that breaks the rock of our resistance. I ask You Lord to use Your word in my life this day.

January 26— Jeremiah 24:7

I will give them a heart to know me, that I am the Lord. They will be my people, and I will be their God, for they will return to me with all their heart.

Lord, with the apostle Paul, "I am counting all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus, my Lord."

January 27— Jeremiah 27:5

With my great power and outstretched arm I made the earth and its people and the animals that are on it, and I give it to anyone I please. Lord, thank You for the joy that comes when we acknowledge You as the Creator of all things, and that apart from You nothing has come into being that has come into being.

January 28— Jeremiah 29:11

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Lord it is so exciting to know that You have a wonderful plan and purpose for my life. It is my desire to know and experience that plan and purpose.

REFLECTION			

January 29— Jeremiah 29:12, 13

Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.

Lord, I am before You this day in prayer, and I am seeking You with all of my heart.

January 30— Jeremiah 31:3

The Lord appeared to us in the past, saying: "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with loving-kindness."

Lord, it was Your love in the past to save me, it is Your love in the present that sustains me, and it is Your love in the future that will take me safely home.

January 31— Jeremiah 31:25

"I will refresh the weary and satisfy the faint."

Lord, refresh my weary body and satisfy my fainting heart.

FEBRUARY

February 1— Jeremiah 31:33

"This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after that time," declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people." Lord, Thy word have I hid in my heart, that I might not sin against Thee.

February 2— Jeremiah 32:17

"Ah, Sovereign Lord, you have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and outstretched arm. Nothing is too hard for you."

Lord, thank You for the joy this promise brings that there is nothing too hard for You to take care of in my life.

REFLECTION						

February 3— Jeremiah 32:19

Great are your purposes and mighty are your deeds. Your eyes are open to all the ways of men; you reward everyone according to his conduct and as his deeds deserve.

Lord, it is a wonderful thought, to know that You have Your eye upon me this day.

February 4— Jeremiah 32:26, 27

Then the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah: "I am the Lord, the God of all mankind. Is anything too hard for me?"

Lord, I rejoice in the awareness that all things are possible with You.

February 5— Jeremiah 32:33

They turned their backs to me and not their faces; though I taught them again and again, they would not listen or respond to discipline. Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening, and do in my life whatever is necessary to make me more like Your Son.

February 6— Jeremiah 32:38, 39

They will be my people, and I will be their God. I will give them singleness of heart and action, so that they will always fear me for their own good and the good of their children after them.

Lord, I would ask of You this day for a singleness of heart and action.

February 7— Jeremiah 32:40, 41

I will make an everlasting covenant with them: I will never stop doing good to them, and I will inspire them to fear me, so that they will never turn away from me. I will rejoice in doing them good and will assuredly plant them in this land with all my heart and soul. Lord, it means so much to know that You find joy in doing good for us.

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February 8— Jeremiah 33:3

"Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know."

Lord, thank You for the access and audience that we have available to us 24 hours a day.

February 9— Jeremiah 33:8

I will cleanse them from all the sin they have committed against me and will forgive all their sins of rebellion against me.

Lord, this verse reminds me a 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

February 10— Jeremiah 46:3, 4

"Prepare your shields, both large and small, and march out for battle! Harness the horses, mount the steeds! Take your positions with helmets on! Polish your spears, put on your armor!"

Paul told the Ephesians in Ephesians 6:11 "Put on the full armor of God, that you may be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil."

February 11—Jeremiah 50:25

The Lord has opened his arsenal and brought out the weapons of his wrath, for the Sovereign Lord Almighty has work to do in the land of the Babylonians.

Lord, I am reminded again of the weapons of your wrath in the Seal, the Trumpet, and the Bowl Judgments in the Book of Revelation.

REFLECTION		

February 12— Lamentations 3:22, 23

Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassion's never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

Lord, with Jeremiah, I too praise thee this day, with these words: "Great is Your faithfulness".

February 13— Lamentations 3:24

I say to myself, "The Lord is my portion; therefore I will wait for him."

Lord, You are my portion, and I am waiting before You this day.

February 14— Lamentations 3:25

The Lord is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him;

Lord, my hope is in You and You alone, and at the beginning of this day, I am seeking Your face.

February 15— Lamentations 3:26

It is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord.

Lord, knowing that Your timing is always perfect, I am waiting quietly before Thee.

February 16— Lamentations 3:27

REFLECTION

It is good for a man to bear the yoke while he is young.

Lord, I woke up to yoke up, use me however You would desire to do so. I am totally available.

MEI EECHOM		

February 17— Lamentations 3:32

Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love.

Lord, I am reminded of Hebrews 12:11: "All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful, yet to those who have been trained by it afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness."

February 18— Lamentations 3:33

For he does not willingly bring affliction or grief to the children of men.

This verse brings to mind Hebrews 12:7: "It is for discipline that you endure; God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline!"

February 19— Lamentations 3:40

Let us examine our ways and test them, and let us return to the Lord. Lord, thank You for the reminder that we can avoid needless pain and judgment by examining and testing our ways before You.

February 20— Lamentations 3:41, 42

Let us lift up our hearts and our hands to God in heaven, and say: "We have sinned and rebelled and you have not forgiven."

Lord, thank You for the promise that You are close to the brokenhearted and You save those who are crushed in spirit.

February 21— Lamentations 3:57

You came near when I called you, and you said, "Do not fear." Lord, thank You that Your eyes are on the righteous, and Your ears are attentive to their cry.

REFLECTION		

February 22— Ezekiel 2:7

You must speak my words to them, whether they listen or fail to listen, for they are rebellious.

Lord, I am ready and available to speak Your word today. Fill my mouth with Your message.

February 23— Ezekiel 3:10

And he said to me, "Son of man, listen carefully and take to heart all the words I speak to you.

Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening.

February 24— Ezekiel 3:18

"When I say to a wicked man, 'You will surely die,' and you do not warn him or speak out to dissuade him from his evil ways in order to save his life, that wicked man will die for his sin, and I will hold you accountable for his blood."

Lord, I want to be a clean, clear channel for Your word this day to a lost and dying world.

February 25— Ezekiel 3:19

REFLECTION

But if you do warn the wicked man and he does not turn from his wickedness or from his evil ways, he will die for his sin; but you will have saved yourself.

Lord, this reminds me today that I am to stay focused on the communication of the message, not being concerned about the response to it.

NEI EECHON		

February 26— Ezekiel 11:19, 20

I will give them an undivided heart and put a new spirit in them; I will remove from them their heart of stone and give them a heart of flesh. Then they will follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws. They will be my people, and I will be their God.

Lord, I am ready and available for all that You have promised in these verses.

February 27— Ezekiel 12:28

"Therefore say to them, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: None of my words will be delayed any longer; whatever I say will be fulfilled, declares the Sovereign Lord."

Lord, thank You for Paul's words to the Thessalonians: "Faithful is the One who is calling you, who also will do it."

February 28— Ezekiel 15:8

"I will make the land desolate because they have been unfaithful, declares the Sovereign Lord."

Lord, You have reminded me this morning of the precarious circumstances America faces because of her unfaithfulness.

MARCH

March 1— Ezekiel 16:59

"This is what the Sovereign Lord says: I will deal with you as you deserve, because you have despised my oath by breaking the covenant.

Lord, I am reminded of the words in Hebrews 10:31: "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God."

REFLECTION		

March 2— Ezekiel 18:4

For every living soul belongs to me, the father as well as the son – both alike belong to me. The soul who sins is the one who will die. Paul's words to the Romans in chapter 6, verse 23 comes to mind this morning: "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

March 3— Ezekiel 18:31

Rid yourselves of all the offenses you have committed, and get a new heart and a new spirit. Why will you die, O house of Israel? Lord, my desire is to rid myself of anything that offends You, so that with a new heart and a new spirit I might worship You.

March 4— Ezekiel 22:14

Will your courage endure or your hands be strong in the day I deal with you? I the Lord have spoken, and I will do it.

Lord, whatever it takes, my supreme desire is to bring You joy and delight.

March 5— Ezekiel 22:30

"I looked for a man among them who would build up the wall and stand before me in the gap on behalf of the land so I would not have to destroy it, but I found none.

Lord, my desire this morning is expressed in Colossians 1:10: "So that you may walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please Him in all respects, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God."

REFLECTION		

March 6— Ezekiel 24:14

"I the Lord have spoken. The time has come for me to act. I will not hold back; I will not have pity, nor will I relent. You will be judged according to your conduct and your actions, declares the Sovereign Lord."

My thoughts this morning go to 1 Peter 4:17: "For it is time for judgment to being with the household of God if it begins with us first, what will be the outcome for those who do not obey the gospel of God?"

March 7— Ezekiel 33:7

"Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel; so hear the word I speak and give them warning from me.

Lord, teach me more and more of Your word, that I might faithfully warn this generation.

March 8— Ezekiel 33:11

Say to them, 'As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign Lord, I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live. Turn! Turn from your evil ways! Why will you die, O house of Israel?'

Lord, I am reminded of 2 Peter 3:9 this morning: "The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance.

REFLECTION		

March 9— Ezekiel 33:31

My people come to you, as they usually do, and sit before you to listen to your words, but they do not put them into practice. With their mouths they express devotion, but their hearts are greedy for unjust gain.

Lord, the words of James come to my attention this morning: "But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves."

March 10— Ezekiel 34:11

"For this is what the Sovereign Lord says: I myself will search for my sheep and look after them."

Lord, my mind goes back to Psalm 23 this morning: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall lack nothing."

March 11— Ezekiel 34:15, 16

I myself will tend my sheep and have them lie down, declares the Sovereign Lord. I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured and strengthen the weak, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy. I will shepherd the flock with justice. Lord, my thoughts remain in Psalm 23: "He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters, He restores my soul. He guides me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake."

March 12—Ezekiel 38:23

And so I will show my greatness and my holiness, and I will make myself known in the sight of many nations. Then they will know that I am the Lord.'

Lord, I worship and praise You this day for Your greatness and holiness.

REFLECTION			

March 13—Ezekiel 39:8

It is coming! It will surely take place, declares the Sovereign Lord. This is the day I have spoken of.

Lord, my thoughts turn to Revelation 22:12 this morning: "Behold, I am coming quickly and My reward is with Me to render to every man according to what he has done."

March 14— Daniel 1:8

But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine, and he asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way.

Lord, I recall 2 Corinthians 6:17, 18 this morning: "Therefore, come out from their midst and be separate', says the Lord, 'and do not touch what is unclean, and I will welcome you, and I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to Me', says the Lord Almighty."

March 15— Daniel 2:20, 21

DEEL ECTION

And said: "Praise be to the name of God for ever and ever; wisdom and power are his. He changes times and seasons; he sets up kings and deposes them. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning.

Lord, I would lift up Your Name in praise for Your wisdom, Your strength, and Your sovereignty.

REFLECTION		

March 16— Daniel 3:16-18

Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied to the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to save us from it, and he will rescue us from your hand, O king. But even if he does not, we want you to know, O king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

Lord, thank You that sometimes You deliver us from the fiery furnace and other times You go with us through it. Whatever You choose is best for me.

March 17— Daniel 3:25

He said, "Look! I see four men walking around in the fire, unbound and unharmed, and the fourth looks like a son of the gods."

Lord, thank You for Your words to Moses in Exodus 3:14: "My presence will go

with you and I will give you rest."

Now, I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise and exalt and glorify the King of heaven, because everything he does is right and all his ways are just. And those who walk in pride he is able to humble.

Lord, I am reminded of the question in Genesis 18:25 "Will not the judge of all the earth do right?" The answer is "Yes Lord, You never make a mistake."

REFLECTION		

March 19— Daniel 5:17

Then Daniel answered the king, "You may keep your gifts for yourself and give your rewards to someone else. Nevertheless, I will read the writing for the king and tell him what it means.

Lord, thank You, that we do not have to turn to these satanic substitutes, but we can trust in the Lord with all of our heart, and lean not on our own understanding. In all our ways, acknowledge Him, and He will make our paths straight.

March 20— Daniel 6:10

Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before.

The words of Peter in Acts 4:19, 20 come to mind: "But Peter and John answered and said to them, Whether it is right in the sight of God to give heed to you rather than to God, you be the judge. For we cannot stop speaking what we have seen and heard."

March 21— Daniel 7:14

He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all peoples, nations and men of every language worshipped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed.

Lord, those words in Revelation 19 come to my mind this morning: "Hallelujah! For the Lord, our God, the Almighty reigns! Let us rejoice and be glad and give the glory to Him!"

REFLECTION			

March 22— Daniel 9:3

So I turned to the Lord God and pleaded with him in prayer and petition, in fasting, and in sackcloth and ashes.

Lord, my passion for this day is to pray and to petition with such intensity that the result might be a mighty moving of Your spirit.

March 23— Daniel 9:19

O Lord, listen! O Lord, forgive! O Lord, hear and act! For your sake, O my God, do not delay, because your city and your people bear your Name."

Lord, I come to You with the prayer of Daniel on my lips: "O Lord, listen! O Lord, forgive! O Lord, hear and act!"

March 24— Daniel 12:3

Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

Lord, Your words in the Sermon on the Mount are in my thoughts this day: "Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works and glorify your Father, who is in heaven."

March 25— Hosea 10:12

Sow for yourselves righteousness, reap the fruit of unfailing love, and break up your unplowed ground; for it is time to seek the Lord, until he comes and showers righteousness on you.

Lord, break up the unplowed ground, because I want to be good soil that will bring forth much fruit.

REFLECTION		

March 26— Micah 6:8

He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

October 23-John 8:10, 11

And straightening up, Jesus said to her, "Woman, where are they? Did no one condemn you?" And she said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you; go your way. From now on sin no more."

Lord, thank You for the wonderful forgiveness, freedom, and future You gave to this woman who was crushed by her failure.

October 24—John 8:12

Again therefore Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows Me shall not walk in the darkness, but shall have the light of life."

October 25—John 8:29

And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. Lord, help me to be faithful to speak Your word today to those who are in bondage.

October 28-John 9:4

We must work the works of Him who sent Me, as long as it is day; night is coming, when no man can work.

Lord, I would be about Your work today knowing that the "night is coming when no man can work."

October 29—John 10:10

The thief comes only to steal, and kill, and destroy; I came that they might have life, and might have it abundantly.

Lord, thank You that the reason You came was to give us life and to give it to us abundantly.

October 30-John 10:11

November 1—John 10:28

And I give eternal life to them, and they shall never perish; and no one shall snatch them out of My hand.

Lord, thank You that I am eternally secure in Your hand.

November 2—John 10:29, 30

My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. I and the Father are one

Father, thank You that You are greater than all and no one is able to snatch us out of Your hand.

November 3—John 11:25, 26

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me shall live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

Lord, I do believe that You are "the resurrection and the life" and we who believe in You shall live eternally.

REFLECTIO)N			

November 4—John 11:33

When Jesus therefore saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her, also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit, and was troubled. Lord, it is such a comfort to know that You identify with us in our grief.

November 5—John 11:35

Jesus wept.

Lord, thank You that You not only identified with Mary inwardly in her grief but outwardly as well, shedding tears over the death of Lazarus.

November 6—John 11:40

Jesus said to her, "Did I not say to you, if you believe, you will see the glory of God?"

Lord, I do believe and I look forward to seeing the full manifestation of Your glory in some future day.

November 7—John 11:43

And when He had said these things, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth."

Lord, thank You that when You speak to those who are dead they respond by coming alive.

November 8—John 11:44

REFLECTION

He who had died came forth, bound hand and foot with wrappings; and his face was wrapped around with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

Lord, it brings so much joy to my heart this day to know that You have power over physical death.

NEI LECTION		

November 9—John 12:21

These therefore came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida of Galilee, and began to ask him, saying, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

Lord, it is my prayer that friends, associates, and strangers will see Jesus in me today.

November 10-John 12:24

Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains by itself alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Lord, the longing of my heart is to die to my desires that I might bear much fruit for You.

November 11—John 12:25

He who loves his life loses it; and he who hates his life in this world shall keep it to life eternal.

Lord, I am reminded of the words of Jim Elliot, "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep, his life, to gain what he cannot lose, eternal life."

November 12—John 12:26

November 17—John 13:34, 35

Lord, thank You for choosing and appointing me with the purpose in mind that my life might bear fruit for You. Father, such is the longing of my heart at the beginning of this new day.

December 4—John 16:13

But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come. Lord, thank You for the presence of the Holy Spirit who is available to guide us into all truth.

These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world.

Lord, thank You for the victory that is ours in the Lord Jesus Christ.

December 9—John 17:4

I glorified Thee on the earth, having accomplished the work which Thou hast given Me to do.

Lord, I want to finish well so that I can say with the Savior that I glorified You on earth and accomplished that which You gave me to do.

December 10—John 17:16,17

They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. Sanctify them in the truth; Thy word is truth.

Lord, I am reading Your Word today that I might be sanctified by Your truth.

December 11—John 19:2, 3

REFLECTION		

December 14—John 19:36, 37

For these things came to pass, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, "Not a bone of Him shall be broken." And again another Scripture says, "They shall look on Him whom they pierced."

Lord, what a witness it is that such minute details of Bible prophecy were fulfilled at the hour of Jesus' death.

December 15—John 19:39

And Nicodemus came also, who had first come to Him by night; bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds weight.

Lord, Nicodemus must have been a born again in order to have the courage to prepare our Savior's body for burial.

December 16—John 20:13, 14

And they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." When she had said this, she turned around, and beheld Jesus standing there, and did not know that it was Jesus.

Lord, thank You that You took time on resurrection Sunday to care about Mary's weeping and to satisfy her search.

December 17—John 20:15

Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing Him to be the gardener, she said to Him, "Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have laid Him, and I will take Him away."

Sometimes amid our tears we fail to see the solution, the Savior.

REFLECTION			

December 18-John 20:16

Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him in Hebrew, "Rabboni!" (which means, Teacher).

Lord, help me to recognize Your voice as You speak to me through Your Word.

December 19—John 20:19

When therefore it was evening, on that day, the first day of the week, and when the doors were shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you."

Lord, my prayer for this day is that Your peace would be my portion.

December 20—John 20:21

Jesus therefore said to them again, "Peace be with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you."

Lord, I would want to be busy this day involved in the mission that You have given to me.

December 21—John 20:27, 28

Then He said to Thomas, "Reach here your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand, and put it into My side; and be not unbelieving, but believing." Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!"

Lord, how comforting it is that You took time to satisfy the doubts of Thomas that You had truly risen from the dead.

December 22—John 20:31

But these have been written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.

Lord, I thank You for inspiring John to write this marvelous text proving beyond the shadow of a doubt that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God.

December 23—John 21:3

Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will also come with you." They went out, and got into the boat; and that night they caught nothing.

Lord, help me not to forget what Peter forgot--that is, without You we can do nothing.

December 24—John 21:4

But when the day was now breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus.

Lord, forgive me for not recognizing the times that You have come to speak to me through Your Word and through the word of a faithful friend. Let me be ever aware of You, even as the world prepares to celebrate your birth.

December 25—John 21:6

And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right-hand side of the boat, and you will find a catch." They cast therefore, and then they were not able to haul it in because of the great number of fish.

Lord, on this Your birthday, help me to cast my net on the right side because I want to be a successful fisher of men.

December 27—John 21:14

This is now the third time that Jesus was manifested to the disciples, after He was raised from the dead.

Lord, each of the disciples' three encounters with the risen Christ must have been incredible experiences. Lord, I cannot wait for Your kingdom when I see You face to face!

December 28—John 21:15

So when they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My lambs."

Lord, the confession of my lips is that I do love You and I want to be constructively involved in the ministry You have in mind for me today.

December 29—John 21:16

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He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Shepherd My sheep."

Lord, You know my heart better than anyone else, and You know that I love You.

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December 30-John 21:17

He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Tend My sheep."

Lord, You have my heart and whatever You want me to do today, I am ready and available.

December 31—John 21:22

Jesus said to him, "If I want him to remain until I come, what is that to you? You follow Me!"

Lord, as You prepare my heart for the new year I want to be focused on following You.
